APPROVAL OF AGENDA

A motion was made / seconded, (Bob Boesch / Buffy McDaniel) to approve the August 29, 2024 agenda as presented. Motion carries.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

None.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A. Approval of July 25, 2024 Board of Directors Meeting Minutes, Exhibit 1

A motion was made / seconded, (Buffy McDaniel / Gary Bacom) to approve the July 25, 2024 Board of Directors Meeting minutes as presented, Exhibit 1. Motion carries.

FINANCIAL REPORT

A. Approval of July 25, 2024 Finance Committee Meeting Minutes, Exhibit 2

A motion was made / seconded, (Gary Bacom / Bob Boesch) to approve the July 25, 2024 Finance Committee minutes as presented. Motion carries.

B. July District Financials – Informational Only, Exhibit 3

Kory Billings reported that the financials are for informational purposes only as we're on the transition from Dawnita Castle's bookkeeping method to online method. When the two systems merged there were a lot of journal entries that didn't merge appropriately. The numbers are correct, but the accountant that we're now using asked us not to give formal approval because she wants to get those corrected.

There is \$3.3M in the PNC LAIF account, which is the interest-bearing account and as of July 31, 2024, there is \$279,000 in general checking account at PNC. Westamerica Bank checking account had \$2M cash on hand we are about \$4.5M to \$5M cash on hand.

Expenses in the past month were \$113,00 higher, which is the same amount as the property insurance that we had to pay out annually.

As of July 1, 2024, we will not be doing journal entries, everything has a bill and a payment to the bill. This will clarify QuickBooks very easily and allow QuickBooks to be used in the way it was meant to be. Journal entries confuse the system as it doesn't know which account to deduct it from. He is not saying the way Dawnita Castle did it is wrong, it's just the way they always did it and they always passed the audits. It's a merger error and we need time to figure it out and we want to move everything into the right categories.

Buffy McDaniel asked if we couldn't copy all the accounts that Dawnita Castle had and create this new QuickBooks series. Kory Billings replied that this is what we're doing is now creating the accounts, but it's taking us into everyone of her journal entries manually and read it and changing it. We need to open it, look at each invoice and move it into the right category. Categories will now be Administration, Bloss Site and Castle Site, as of July 1, 2024, everything has a category.

Kathy Flaherty thanked Kory Billings for his report.

C. July Payroll, Electronic Payments & Bill Payment List, Exhibit 4

A motion was made / seconded, (Buffy McDaniel / Bob Boesch) to approve and accept the July total payroll in the amount of \$12,143.05; total accounts payable of \$226,755.77 for a grand total distribution of \$238,898.82, Exhibit 4. Motion carries.

Kory Billings added that in the future on the Bill Payment List he can add the appropriate category, such as Administration, Bloss or Castle for each bill if that will be helpful. Buffy McDaniel replied that she was working on the square footage of each building, working off the information, rents received, and what is required as a board. She is working on it and will share it.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORT

A. Facilities Report

Kory Billings reported that we are getting reports of maintenance issues here and there, but they're standard issues.

We just finished replacing the air conditioning unit in the former labor and delivery area. All rooms and hallways will now be able to cool off. If we do things in stages and continue to move forward with progress, it's not one large project we must look at slowly improving the building.

Out at Castle Site, we had some questions from a tenant regarding a lease and whether we're responsible or not for inspecting a generator and some other items. He is working with Tom Ebersole, Legal Counsel.

Castle Family Health Centers is doing zero maintenance on any areas of the facility that they are not leasing themselves. They were doing certain things for all the tenants, now they are only doing for themselves. There are certain inspections that they were doing, and we will try and figure all of this out.

Buffy McDaniel asked if Castle Family Health Centers subleases to the other tenants. Kory Billings responded that the other tenants lease from Bloss Memorial Healthcare District.

B. Senior Information Day

Fily Cale distributed information to the board of directors on Senior Information Day to be held on Tuesday, September 17, 2024, at the Community Center, which is provided for free. Kory Billings added that as participants are signing up, their company logo is being added to the flyers and brochures. Advertising through Radio Merced should begin next week.

Booths will be set up around the room and they will provide information on senior services, such as information on Medicare enrollment, hearing checks and many other services. The goal is to provide information to our community because of the lack of how to access these services. Merced County will be letting us know which entities they will be bringing in. We will also provide lunch.

OLD BUSINESS

A. 2024-2025 Sports Physicals Update

Kory Billings reported that Dr. Boggs has provided 778 physicals. Anytime a school has a minimum of 20 students, they call Dr. Boggs and he will go to the school site to perform the physicals. If a student has been unable to make the days he has set aside, Dr. Boggs has been able to see the student in his office and not charged them more.

In May Dr. Boggs and his staff went to Atwater High School three times and saw 495 students and to Buhach High School 1 time and saw 152 students. He is also engaging the nursing clubs at the schools and getting them involved by doing blood pressure and weight checks, supervised by his staff.

NEW BUSIINESS

A. RFP for Roof Replacement, Exhibit 6

Kory Billings stated that as we did pest control tenting, they commented on how well the tiles themselves held up so well. The downside is that most of the tiles were installed in 1933, and

they used copper wire, which ties one tile to the next and now this wiring has rusted and is snapping, causing the tiles to begin slipping down. We drew up an RFP, submitted it to the Valley Builders Exchange and received four bids.

San Joaquin Roofing, Inc bid \$360,386.00 for a tile roof with a 2nd option for clay tiles at \$413,875.00; Fresno Roofing bid \$221,729.00 and gutters optional at \$11,750.00; Tru Tech bid \$132,700.00 for concrete tiles and King's Roofing bid \$244,104.00 for concrete tiles and gutters optional at \$35,835.00

The bids vary, and everyone was told that gutters were optional and that they could bid if they chose to, and two did. Each company came out and did go on top of the building. 'Although he did not see Tru Tech go on the roof.

In viewing a map of the roof with the board, Kory Billings pointed out that there are two different colored areas of roof, light red, which was replaced somewhere in the 1990's and a darkish red section, which is what we're replacing. He is confident in most of the bids.

Some things have been fixed to the roof, but now you can see gaps where you can see the wood in certain areas where the tile has slipped down. We currently have clay tiles and concrete tiles are cheaper and most of the bids are concrete. The tiles will still be S shaped to give the same curb appeal. Another option is asphalt, but it will change the look of the building. They will also be testing the tiles for asbestos and if there is we will need to have that removed. We also don't know the condition of the plywood until the roof is removed.

The bid was put together based on what Grandmark has done for us in the past and we utilized their advice. They did not bid on the RFP, they had bid prior to going out to RFP and chose not to bid on the RFP.

Buffy McDaniel asked if instead of "roof replacement" could we consider a "roof inspection" and see about repairing what may need to be repaired. Kory Billings stated that because of the tile, they would all need to be removed and rewired back together as they are snapping and disintegrating it would cost more.

Kory Billings stated that there are funds set aside for building maintenance, there is a building fund and an investment account, and it would need to come out of one of those. With an RFP process there is a time frame that kicks in and we must report out. The investment account has almost \$200,000 which is currently available for any repair.

Tru Tech has a bid of almost \$100,000 less than the other bidders. Tom Ebersole, Legal Counsel, stated that California law requires detailed justifications for not choosing the lowest bidder, distinguishing between non-responsive and non-responsible bidders.

Staff are given directions to go back to Tru Tech to receive in detail what they are bidding on and to bring it back to the board. Kory Billings will contact Tru Tech and obtain additional information. A special board meeting may need to be held.

A motion was made / seconded, (Gry Bacom / Bob Boesch) to have Kory Billings reach out to Tru Tech for additional information and to Fresno Roofing to confirm if they are only bidding on "A" and "B" as noted on their "map" of the roof, Exhibit 6. Motion carried.

B. High Schools Medical Technician TB Testing Ratification, Exhibit 7

Kory Billings reported that at the last board meeting, the board had approved to provide some medical equipment for the nursing program at the high schools. 110 students are required to have a TB test for this internship.

Dr. Boggs heard of this need and reached out to BMHD; there should be some sports physicals money left. He stated that a normal TB test is \$55 and if Bloss is willing to sponsor this, he will administer the testing including returning to read the test at a cost of \$35 per student, at the same cost as a sports physical.

A motion was made / seconded, (Bob Boesch / Gary Bacom) to have Dr. Boggs administer the TB testing for the high schools at \$35 per student, Exhibit 7. Motion carried.

C. <u>Usage of Bloss Facilities by Third Party Entities</u>

Kory Billings mentioned that from time to time we get a request to use our facilities, and some are long-term requests. For years we have been partners with a local group who utilize one of our buildings and there is nothing in writing.

He is asking direction from the board of directors to let this continue as is or should we get something in writing. He spoke to Tom Ebersole, Legal Counsel and there are several ways to address this, should we use a lease or get a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).

Traditionally when you use something for free, you do something on the other side to help maintain the property, there is nothing in writing. They don't have any direction as to what is expected from them to continue using the property for free.

Tom Ebersole, Legal Counsel, added that just adding the need for written agreements with entities using the facilities and the responsibility of establishing general standards. The written agreement will clarify expectations and liability with the intention to cover all entities using the facilities. It's not an amount to be paid, it's the standards, pick up trash, paint over graffiti, etc.

No motion needed per legal counsel.

BOARD MEMBER REPORTS

Kathy Flaherty thanked the board of directors for their sponsorship of the Lights of Hope. The display will be at her house on Saturday, Augus 31, 2024.

We strongly recommend that blends, ranges, streaks or flashed tiles be used to help mask any variations that maybe visible in the tiles. However, please note that variations on single color roof tiles may be present. As the roof ages, the variation tends to be less noticeable. Eagle does not warrant color due to the tile exposure to the elements. Variations in sand, cement and coloring oxides may also cause texture and/or color shading during the manufacturing process. This variance is not detectable through standard quality control practices. Please note that installation of our roof tiles constitutes acceptance. It is the responsibility of the installing roofing contractor/general contractor and/or homeowner to inspect, select and place roofing tiles in a manner that will optimize the beauty of the roof and to ensure the desired appearance.

HAIL: As the result of EAGLE standard weight tiles' excellent performance under laboratory testing, a growing number of property insurance companies offer significant discounts from published rates in hail-prone areas. Check with your insurance agent or your State Insurance Commissioner.

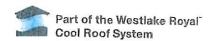

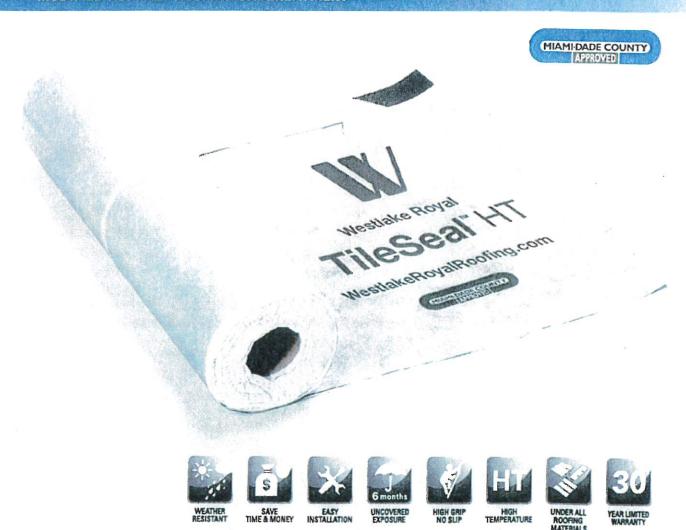

US Tile clay roof tiles are warranted to you, the original property owner(s), by the manufacturer, Westlake Royal Roofing Solutions' ("Westlake Royal"). Westlake Royal warrants that the clay tiles manufactured by Westlake Royal will pass applicable moisture absorption and transverse break strength tests under the conditions and using the methods applied by IAPMO Uniform Evaluation Service ("IAPMO") in report ER-411 that are in existence at date of manufacture and which are applicable to the Product. This warranty has been delivered to the original property owner(s) in connection with the original property owner(s) purchase of Westlake Royal clay roof tiles and remains in effect for as long as the original property owner(s) are living and are the owner(s) of the property for which the roofing was applied up to a maximum period of fifty (50) years. Please see below for warranty terms regarding transferability. For legal entities other than natural persons, the duration of the warranty is fifty (50) years and shall not be transferable.

Westlake Royal further warrants that the clay tile roofing products manufactured by Westlake Royal, after removal of foreign surface deposits and based on a comparison between the exposed and unexposed areas of a given tile, will not show a color fade in excess of 4 Hunter E Units as a result of normal weathering or ultraviolet exposure, for a period of twenty (20) years from date of original installation.

This warranty should be registered online at WestlakeRoyalRoofing. com within thirty (30) days after completion of installation of the roof tiles or purchase from the builder of your newly constructed home. This warranty is subject to the conditions, remedies, transfer requirements, limitations and legal rights stated in this warranty. All of the conditions and requirements stated in this warranty must be met in order to make this warranty valid.

NOTICE, INSPECTION, REMEDIES AND CONDITIONS:

Notice and Inspection: If you think your roof tiles are defective, you must contact Westlake Royal explaining your problem within ninety (90) days after your discovery at 1-800-669-8435(TILE) or email askcustomerservice@westlake.net. The date the roof tiles were installed or the date you purchased the home must be furnished to Westlake Royal.

If you choose to exercise your rights under this warranty, do not begin any repairs prior to writing Westlake Royal and receiving its permission to do so. Westlake Royal must have a reasonable opportunity to inspect and test the roof tiles before repairs are begun.

Remedies: If your roof tiles are found to be defective, in accordance with this warranty. Westlake Royal will furnish a new tile, free of charge, to replace each tile which falls the IAPMO tests or color fade tests. The manufacturer reserves the right to test all tiles before replacement. This warranty specifically excludes any obligation to pay the cost of labor to replace or reinstall the tiles for any defect. Also excluded are any labor costs required to correct improper installation or improper maintenance and all costs of materials required other than the replacement tiles.

Conditions: Westlake Royal reserves the right to discontinue or make changes in its roof tile products. If your roof tiles are not available and Westlake Royal decides to replace the defective roof tiles, Westlake Royal shall have the right to substitute roof tiles which it considers of substantially equal quality and price. Due to the nature of clay roof tiles, Westlake Royal cannot provide positive assurance of a perfect color match between different production runs. Therefore, it is understood that there may be a color difference between the original products installed and any replacement tiles provided under the terms of this warranty. All warranty claims shall be settled between you and Westlake Royal.

TRANSFER OF WARRANTY

This warranty is transferable by the original property owner(s), who are natural persons, while living, only to the next owner(s) of the property to which the roof tiles are attached, provided Westlake Royal receives electronic notice of the transfer of title of the property by re-registering the property online at WestlakeRoyalRoofing.com within thirty (30) days of the date of transfer of ownership. If you require assistance, please contact Westlake Royal at 1-800-669-8453(TILE) or e-mail askcustomerservice@westlake.net. Failure to file the required notice of transfer within such thirty (30) day period shall relieve Westlake Royal of any further obligation to the next owner(s) under the terms of the warranty. Upon meeting the above conditions of transfer, all warranty periods under this warranty, except for the above color fade warranty, shall be limited in duration to the life of the next following owner(s) for so long as such owner(s) own the property to which the roof tiles were applied, subject to a maximum period of fifty (50) years from the date of the installation. 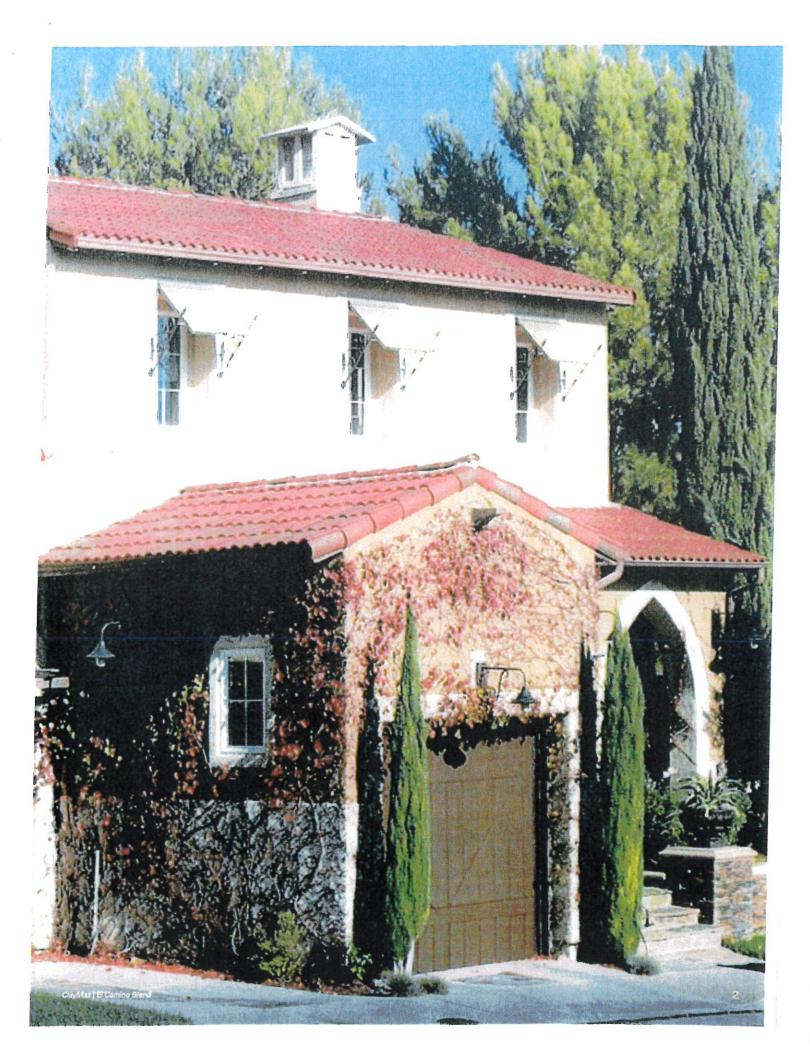

Maintaining Your US Tile Roof

MILDEW, ALGAE AND MOSS

We recommend that a professional cleaning company be used, so that you avoid the dangers associated with walking on a wet tile roof.

Many climates across the country are conducive to mildew, algae and moss growth on everything from glass, stucco, siding and driveways, to roofing products including clay tiles. While this growth can result in a dirty surface appearance, it can be treated to restore the original look.

Mildew, algae and moss do not grow directly on the tile but grow on the accumulation of dust and other organic materials that settle on the tile. When enough cycles of heat, moisture and light are present, these spores start to grow.

Many environmental variables affect the potential for this organic growth. The location of the house, the direction the house is facing to the sun, and the quantity of trees, canals and lakes in the area can contribute to mildew growth.

Fortunately, mildew, algae and moss can be removed or treated. If the growth returns, the treatment can be repeated as necessary.

CLEANING

The following method is recommended to properly pressure clean the surface of your roof to remove dirt, algae, mildew or moss.

In most applications, a pressure cleaner set at approximately 1200 psi should be used. The tip of the nozzle of the pressure cleaner should be kept approximately one to two feet from the tile. The limited pressure and distance from the tile are used to prevent damaging the surface. Most modern pressure cleaners have an induction system to deliver a 10% solution of chlorine to water. This will help to temporarily remove the mildew, algae or moss when using the recommended reduced pressure.

WEATHERING EFFECTS

US Tile* clay roof tiles will be subjected to the worst nature can offer. The combination of elements that destroy most other roof coverings will not, however, seriously affect the protective properties of clay tiles. Over time, the surface of any product left unattended will show signs of aging, and clay roof tiles are no exception.

Clay tiles are produced by baking molded clay. The density of the clay is determined by the length of time and temperature at which it is heated. Colors of clay tiles range from shades of white, yellow, orange and brown. Clay tiles are primarily colored by the clay materials that are present during molding.

CHOOSING A CONTRACTOR

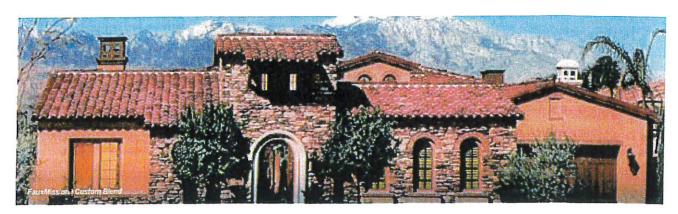
Regardless of whether you just want your roof inspected, (which should be done every couple of years), or have specific repair needs, you should take some precautionary steps in selecting a roofing contractor.

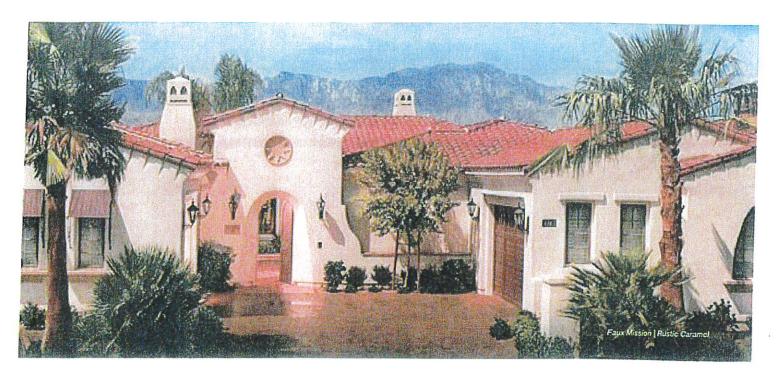
If your roof is still under warranty from the original installation, you should contact the original contractor for all inspections or repairs so that your original contractor's warranty is not voided

Ensure that your contractor secures all necessary permits before any work begins or you may be responsible for any code violations.

Even considering its unsurpassed durability, a clay tile roof does require regular maintenance to continue to perform optimally. Replacing broken tiles, removing algae, mildew and moss, or cleaning and re-coating your clay tile roof are all vital steps in maintaining its aesthetic and protective qualities for years to come.

Choosing a professional roofing contractor for repairs and maintenance is the best method to ensure safety and the longevity of your roof.

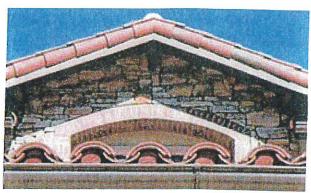

Avoid walking on your roof tile unless it is absolutely necessary

Do not walk on your roof unless you have adequate fall protection. Caution should be exercised to ensure your personal safety and prevent damage to roof tiles that may void your warranty. Roof traffic is specifically mentioned in the Special Exclusions section of your warranty. Roof tiles broken by foot traffic should be replaced as soon as possible. Broken tiles may allow penetration of water and UV rays to damage the waterproofing underlayment beneath the tiles.

There are certain methods of traversing the roof that may minimize damage. It is recommended you step at the bottom three inches of the installed tile. This section is supported by the lapped tile beneath it and the weight is then transferred through it to the deck below.

Keep in mind that activities such as cleaning gutters and hanging holiday lights can be accomplished from a ladder rather than walking on your roof. Ladder braces may be attached to avoid damage to your gutters and tiles.

Remember the following tips if you must walk on your roof tiles:

- Orient your feet in a horizontal direction. Try to distribute your weight evenly and walk as softly as possible.
- Distribute your weight on the high points of the adjacent tiles.
- A great option is to use walk pads to distribute your weight over a larger area. Pads may be fabricated in several ways but are typically made from sheets of plywood cut into 2" x 2" sections. The underside of these pads should be fitted with softer material such as carpet or rigid foam that will help distribute the weight and prevent slippage.
- Avoid walking on hips or valleys to prevent damage to specially cut tiles that are more difficult to replace.

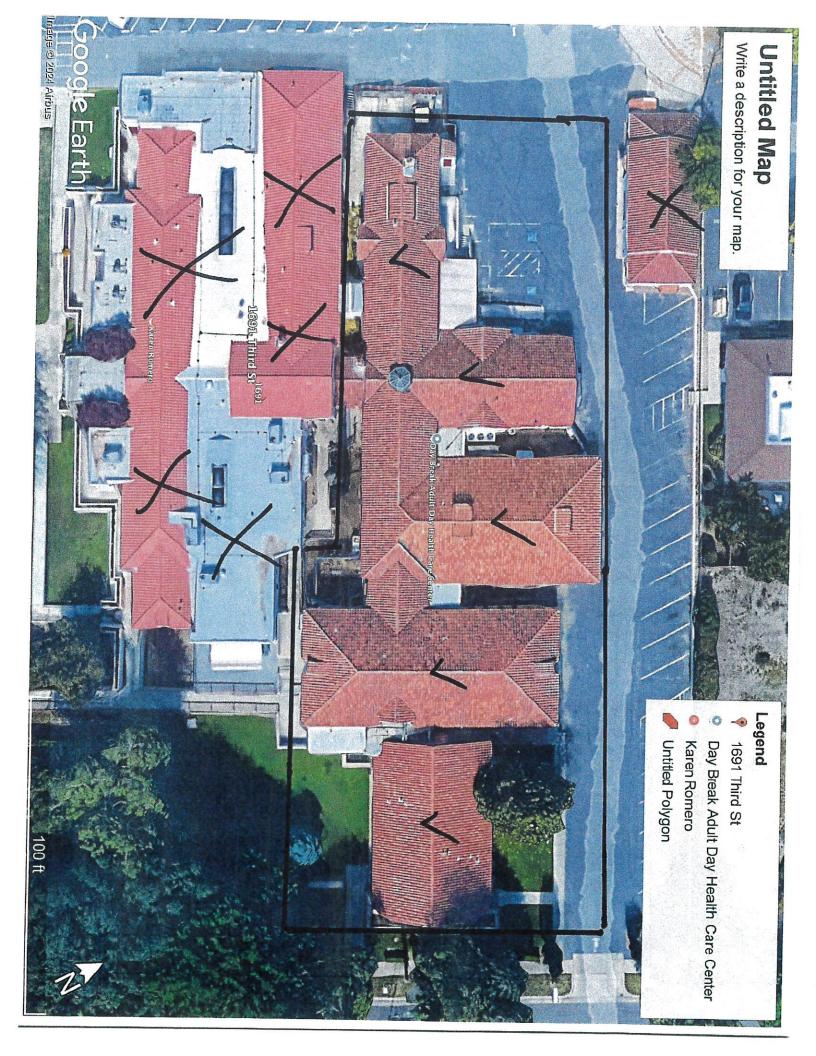

DEFINITIONS:

- 1. "Public Official" means a member, officer, employee, or consultant of a state or local government agency. The term "public official" also includes individuals who perform the same our substantially the same duties as a individual holding an office or a position listed in Government Code Section 87200, including "other public officials who manage a public investments" as that term is defined in 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18720.
- 2. "Member" shall include, but not limited to, salaried or unsalaried members of boards or commissions with decision-making authority. A board or commission possess decision-making authority whenever;
 - a. It-may make a final governmental decision;

- 3. "Designated Employee" is an officer, employee, member, or consultant of an agency whose position is designated in the code because the position entails the <u>making or participation in the making of governmental decisions</u> which may foreseeable have a material effect on any financial interest. (Government Code Section 82019).
 - a. Making a governmental decision means the person:
 - i. Votes on a matter;
 - ii. Appoints a person;

 - ii. Adopt or enforce a law;
 - iii. Issue, deny, suspend, or revoke any permit, license, application, certificate, approval, order or similar authorization or entitlement;
 - iv. Authorize the agency to enter into, modify, or renew a contract provided it is the type of contract, which requires agency approval;
 - v. Grant agency approval to a contract which requires agency approval and in which the agency is a party or to the specifications for such a contract;
 - vi. Grant agency approval to a plan, design, report, study, or similar item;

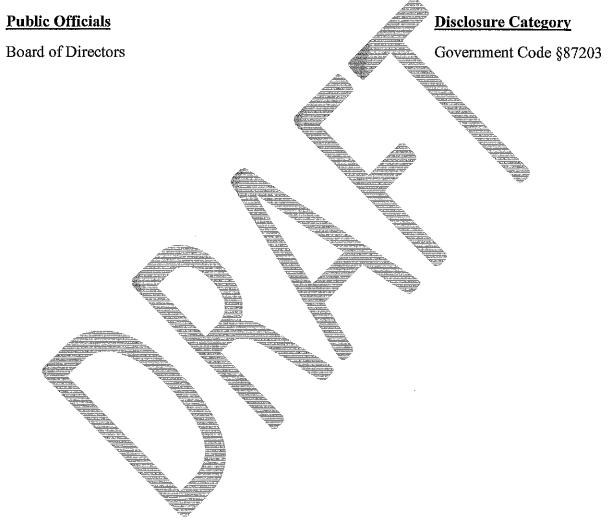

<u>Section 2:</u> The provisions of Section 18730, and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are incorporated herein by reference and, along with the attached **Appendices "A", and "B",** in which District employees are designated and the disclosure category is set forth, collectively constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of Bloss Memorial Healthcare District.

<u>Section 3:</u> Pursuant to Section 18730(b)(4), designated employees of Bloss Memorial Healthcare District shall file statements of Economic Interest with the district. Any employee already required to submit a disclosure statement (Form 700) pursuant to Government Code sections 87200 and 87203 may submit a copy of that statement in lieu of any filing required by this Code, provided that no additional disclosure would be required by this Code.

<u>Section 4:</u> Individuals holding the designated positions outlined in **Appendix "B"** shall file their statements with the District who shall be and shall perform then duties of the filing officer for Bloss Memorial Healthcare District. Statements will be available for inspection and reproduction pursuant to Government Code Section 81008.
